Identifying Students' AP Potential



OBJECTIVE

Objective: Provide an overview of tools to help school administrators, counselors, and principals identify students for 13-14 Advanced Placement courses utilizing a set of existing tools such as PLAN exam results and the PSAT AP Potential tool.

WHAT ARE AP COURSES?

- College-level course taught exclusively for high school students
- Course offered at a high school
- Taught by high school teachers
- Opportunity to earn college credit/placement
- Qualifying exam score required
- Accepted at over 90% of higher education institutions

A score of 3 or better correlates closely with college readiness.

BENEFITS OF AP

Research shows that students who complete AP® coursework are:

- ✓ better prepared for college-level work
- ✓ stand-outs in the college admissions process
- ✓ more likely to continue beyond their freshman year in college
- ✓ more likely to graduate within 4-5 years
- ✓ more competitive in qualifying for scholarships

AP INCENTIVE: SB. 202

S.B. 202 (2013 Leg. Session) increases the incentive to complete AP courses:

- Aligns the Core Four Diploma course sequence with the TOPS core sequence
- Ensures students going to four-year colleges have taken a true college prep curriculum and have every chance to receive TOPS
- Creates incentives for students to take more rigorous AP courses by giving courses approved by the state additional weight in the calculation of the TOPS GPA

LA schools have responded—LA <u>led the nation</u> in AP participation growth during the 2013 Spring exam period (39%)

AP PARTICIPATION GROWTH

Schools and students are responding to these incentives.

 Louisiana's AP exam participation in the Spring 2013 testing cycle grew by approx. 39%

AP & ACCOUNTABILITY

The new cohort Graduation Index recognizes a score of 3 or higher on at least one AP exam as the highest level of achievement earned by a cohort graduate.

Each student with at least one AP score of 3 or higher will earn the maximum **150** points toward the Graduation Index.

Students who take an AP course and earn a 1 or 2 on an AP exam receive **110 points** toward the Graduation Index.

IDENTIFYING AP STUDENTS

Schools can use PLAN & PSAT data to identify students capable of earning a 3 or higher on the AP.

Receive exam grades



Correlate exam grades with AP scores



Estimate new students' AP potential

- Every student takes PLAN exams and many take the PSAT
- Many later take
 AP courses
 provides that
 provide a rich
 source of data

Compare previous students' PLAN/PSAT scores with same students' later AP performance

- Use previous correlations to estimate new students' AP potential
- Data provides probabilities, not certainties

AP Exam	PLAN Test	50% Chance 3 or Higher AP Score	75% Chance 3 or Higher AP Score	50% Chance 4 or Higher AP Score
Biology	Avg. Math & Science	23	26	26.5
Calculus BC	Avg. Math & Science	21	24.5	25
English Lit	Avg. English & Reading	21.5	24	26.5
U.S. History	Avg. English & Reading	22.5	26	26.5

Using PLAN scores, we can identify students with potential to earn a 3 or higher on each AP Exam

PSAT STATISTICS


AP Exam	PSAT/NMSQT Score	% of students likely to score a 3 or Higher on the AP
Calculus AB	61-80 (Math score range)	77.1% or more
English Lit	111-160 (Crit. Read + Writing score range)	77.3% or more
US History	171-240 (Total Score range)	76.6% or more

PSAT scores offer useful guidance for three different AP courses.

Biology	Over 50% chance of 4 or higher (PLAN)
Euro. Hist.	Over 50% chance of 3 or higher (PLAN)
Calculus AB	Over 77.1% chance of 3 or higher (PSAT)
English Lit.	Over 77.3% chance of 3 or higher (PSAT)
